CONSENT JUDGMENT

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Plaintiff's Motion (Doc. 82) is **granted**. There being no just reason for delay, the Clerk of Court shall kindly enter the following Judgment under Rule 54(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure as to Defendants Gary Pryor; ZipRemit, Inc.; and Lendaily Inc..

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this Final Judgment.

- to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud; (a)
- to obtain money or property by means of any untrue statement of a material fact or (b) any omission of a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- (c) to engage in any transaction, practice, or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon the purchaser.

It Is Further Ordered, Adjudged, And Decreed that, as provided in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d)(2), the foregoing paragraph also binds the following who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise: (a) Defendant's officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and (b) other persons in active concert or participation with Defendant or with anyone described in (a).

III.

It Is Further Ordered, Adjudged, And Decreed that pursuant to Section 21(d)(5) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(5)], Defendant is permanently restrained and enjoined from directly or indirectly, including, but not limited to, through any entity owned or controlled by Defendant, participating in the issuance, purchase, offer, or sale of any security in an unregistered offering, provided, however, that such injunction shall not prevent Defendant from purchasing or selling securities for his own personal account.

It Is Further Ordered, Adjudged, And Decreed that, as provided in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d)(2), the foregoing paragraph also binds the following who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise: (a) Defendant's officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys; and (b) other persons in active concert or participation with Defendant or with anyone described in (a).

IV.

It Is Further Ordered, Adjudged, And Decreed that Defendant is liable for total disgorgement of \$2,666,705.63, representing net profits gained as a result of the conduct alleged in the Amended Complaint, together with total prejudgment interest thereon in the amount of \$753,137.50, and a civil penalty in the amount of \$2,666,705.63 pursuant to Section 20(d) of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. §77t(d)] and Section 21(d)(3) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78u(d)(3)]. These total amounts of disgorgement and prejudgment interest are broken down as follows: (i) Defendant is solely responsible for paying \$2,486,186.42 in disgorgement plus prejudgment interest thereon of \$739,628.95; and (ii) Defendant is responsible for paying, on a joint and several basis with Relief Defendant Rebecca Pryor, \$180,519.21 in disgorgement plus prejudgment interest thereon of \$13,508.55. Defendant shall satisfy this obligation by paying \$6,086,548.76 to the Securities and Exchange Commission within 30 days after entry of this Final Judgment.

Defendant may transmit payment electronically to the Commission, which will provide detailed ACH transfer/Fedwire instructions upon request. Payment may also be made directly from a bank account via Pay.gov through the SEC website at http://www.sec.gov/about/offices/ofm.htm. The Commission may enforce the Court's judgment for penalties by the use of all collection procedures authorized by law, including the Federal Debt Collection Procedures Act, 28 U.S.C. § 3001 *et seq.*, and moving for civil contempt for the violation of any Court orders issued in this action. Defendant shall pay post judgment interest on any amounts due after 30 days of the entry of this Final Judgment pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1961. The Commission shall hold the funds, together with any interest and income earned thereon (collectively, the "Fund"), pending further order of the Court.

The Commission may propose a plan to distribute the Fund subject to the Court's approval. Such a plan may provide that the Fund shall be distributed pursuant to the Fair Fund provisions of Section 308(a) of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002. The Court shall retain jurisdiction over the administration of any distribution of the Fund, and the Fund may only be disbursed pursuant to an Order of the Court.

Regardless of whether any such Fair Fund distribution is made, amounts ordered to be paid as civil penalties pursuant to this Judgment shall be treated as penalties paid to the government for all purposes, including all tax purposes. To preserve the deterrent effect of the civil penalty, Defendant shall not, after offset or reduction of any award of compensatory damages in any Related Investor Action based on Defendant's payment of disgorgement in this action, argue that he is entitled to, nor shall he further benefit by, offset or reduction of such compensatory damages award by the amount of any part of Defendant's payment of a civil penalty in this action ("Penalty Offset"). If the court in any Related Investor Action grants such a Penalty Offset, Defendant shall, within 30 days after entry of a final order granting the Penalty Offset, notify the Commission's counsel in this

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action and pay the amount of the Penalty Offset to the United States Treasury or to a Fair Fund, as the Commission directs. Such a payment shall not be deemed an additional civil penalty and shall not be deemed to change the amount of the civil penalty imposed in this Judgment. For purposes of this paragraph, a "Related Investor Action" means a private damages action brought against Defendant by or on behalf of one or more investors based on substantially the same facts as alleged in the Amended Complaint in this action.

It Is Further Ordered, Adjudged, And Decreed that (i) solely for purposes of exceptions to discharge set forth in Section 523 of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §523, the allegations in the Amended Complaint are true and deemed admitted by Defendant, and further, any debt for disgorgement, prejudgment interest, civil penalty or other amounts due by Defendant under this Final Judgment or any other judgment, order, consent order, decree or settlement agreement entered in connection with this proceeding, is a debt for the violation by Defendant of the federal securities laws or any regulation or order issued under such laws, as set forth in Section 523(a)(19) of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §523(a)(19); (ii) any debt for disgorgement, prejudgment interest, civil penalty or other amounts due by Defendant under the Final Judgment or any other judgment, order, consent order, decree or settlement agreement entered in connection with this proceeding is a community claim as defined under applicable state or federal law, including but not limited to Sections 101(10)(C) and 541(a)(2) of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §101(10)(C) and 541(a)(2); and (iii) with regard to any debt excepted from discharge pursuant to Section 523 of the Bankruptcy Code, the protection of after-acquired community property does not apply to any interest of his spouse, Rebecca Pryor, in community property as set forth in applicable state or federal law, including but not limited to Section 524(a)(3) of the
